

GUIDELINES FOR LOW-HAZARD CONSUMER FIREWORKS

National Fire Code 2019 (AE); Federal Explosives Act (CE-17)

Under the regulations of the Lethbridge County, Alberta Fire Code, Fire Quality Management Plan, fireworks can be discharged in Lethbridge County, but they cannot be sold.

- 1. Consumer fireworks permits will only be issued to individuals over 18 years of age.
- 2. Applicants must be the legal landowner of the discharge site or have the landowner's written permission to apply.
- 3. The permit holder must contact the City of Lethbridge Public Communications Centre 30 minutes before your display starts and immediately after your display is complete. CALL 403-329-1225.
- 4. The permit holder must confirm that no fire bans or advisory are in place on the day of the event. Please check Lethbridge County website <u>www.lethcounty.ca</u>. Fireworks permits will be suspended if wind speeds exceed 15km/hour.
- 5. A consumer fireworks permit is valid for one event only. However, the date can be changed prior to the scheduled event by notifying Lethbridge County at 403-328-5525 or emailing Lethbridge County Fire Services at bfraser@lethcounty.ca.
- 6. Neighbouring landowners whose properties or livestock may be affected by fireworks discharge must be notified, and permission obtained prior to discharge.
- 7. You'll need to have 2 fire extinguishers at least one being a 10lb ABC in the immediate area.
- 8. You can discharge low-hazard consumer fireworks only (these are under Federal Class 7.2.1 and include items like sparkles, fountains, volcanoes, mines, and snakes). High-hazard fireworks, firecrackers, or special effect pyrotechnic devices are not permitted.
- 9. If you are discharging ground-level fireworks (fireworks that function at 15 metres or lower) they must be discharged in a location with no dry grass or combustible material on the ground beneath them, and the area needs to be thoroughly wet down immediately before the fireworks are discharged.
- 10. Fireworks may not be discharged within 10 meters of any building, shelter, or motor vehicle, or 200 meters of any place where explosives or flammables are stores.
- 11. Fireworks may not be discharged from the highway, road allowance, public beach, over a body of water or park.
- 12. Fireworks should be stored in a cool, dry area, in a secure container, away from excessive heat, open flame, or sparkproducing equipment or tools. There must be a fire extinguisher in any building where fireworks are being stored.
- 13. Fireworks are explosives. Ensure you read and follow the instructions, cautions and warnings on each firework. Fireworks permit holders must follow all terms and conditions outlined on the permit.
