

**WHAT:** Includes the expansion of the Birds of Prey Centre in Coaldale to increase storm water storage capacities. A dry pond and deep basin pond will be constructed to capture storm water and direct it to the Birds of Prey Centre. An additional 300,000m<sup>2</sup> will exist after construction is complete.

**WHERE:** Lethbridge County and the Town of Coaldale

**WHY:** Providing this infrastructure will benefit residents of Lethbridge County and the Town of Coaldale.



## WORK COMPLETED TO DATE

The northwest wetland earthworks are complete, with planting to go ahead in spring 2019. The retention pond and interceptor channel construction is almost complete. Substantial completion is anticipated in spring 2019.

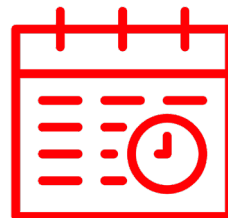
## BENEFIT TO RESIDENTS

Providing additional conveyance capacity of storm water in the Malloy Drain will reduce the risk of damage to infrastructure in the future.
