ADMINISTRATION:

- 1) Lethbridge County Livestock Sector– Business Tax Reduction Request**
The CAO presented a petition from the group and explained that it did not meet the petition requirements under section 232(2) of the Municipal Government Act. The request would instead fall under section 347. It was the CAO's recommendation that staff have time to prepare a more fulsome report and bring back to Council for the June 18 meeting. Council concurred.
- 1) HALO Letter- Update on Funding and Operations**
Council approved that a letter be sent to the Minister of Health inquiring about the status of the Helicopter Emergency Medical Service (HEMS) Review and stating that air ambulance services should be the responsibility of the province rather than municipalities.
